




COLOR WHEEL




Complementary Colors— Opposites attract. Pink (which is in the red family) are a classic complementary color scheme. Pairing two opposite colors creates a stark contrast and sets a high-energy mood.



Triad Colors—Combining three colors might sound like a color explosion in the making. Called a triad color scheme, it works because these three colors are equal distance apart on the wheel. The key here is working with colors of the same intensity so that no one hue overpowers the other.



Monochromatic—Start with one color that you adore, then find another shade just darker and one just lighter. Use a color wheel or paint chips as your guide.



Adjacent Colors— Choose colors that are neighbors on the color wheel. When you enter a room like this you'll be surrounded by soothing colors, without a lot of stark contrasts.
